Corrections

Corrections are sanctions used to punish criminals

• Examples include: imprisonment, parole, probation, and community service



Retribution

 The punishing of a criminal serves as socially acceptable act of revenge for the victim and society




Deterrence

• Corrections are intended to discourage offenders from committing future crimes and to make the rest of society think twice before breaking laws.



Rehabilitation

• Corrections are intended to reform criminals so that they can return to society as law abiding citizens.



Social Protection

 By limiting the freedom of offenders, society protects itself from additional crimes they might commit.









Lifetime Likelihood of Imprisonment





